



Playgroup News – Monday 17th January 2022




Hello Everyone... Here is our Playgroup News for this week...

Look what we've been up to this week!

This week the Squirrel children have been developing their listening skills through identifying animal sounds and nursery rhymes through listening CD's. The children have been exploring the frost and ice outside, learning new vocabulary and this then extended into making frosty pictures.



Turn taking and sharing has also been a focus this week when using the bikes and pushchairs and playing cooperatively with others with rolling tyres across the tables. The children have also had so much sensory fun exploring gloop which we made using cornflour and conditioner. Again, this enabled the Practitioners to introduce new vocabulary to the children as they described the texture and smell whilst using their fine motor skills to mould the gloop into different shapes.



This week the Penguin children have been developing their fine motor skills through a range of threading activities and they have continued to be interested in developing their scissors skills. During outdoor play, the children have been using the jumbo vehicles to support their imaginative play. They have also been exploring the ice and frost, transporting the ice to the mud kitchen where they have incorporated this into their role-play.

The children have had an interest in using the arts and crafts area to make crowns and to build models using the junk modelling, using their own thoughts and ideas to create their own structures.

Small group times have also been introduced this week with a focus on developing the children's literacy and mathematical knowledge.

MAKATON

Each week we will be introducing Makaton signs to the children. Makaton is a unique language programme that uses symbols, signs and speech to enable people to communicate.



With Makaton, signs are used, with speech, in spoken word order. This helps provide extra clues about what someone is saying. Using signs can help people who have no speech or whose speech is unclear. Using symbols can help people who have limited speech and those who cannot, or prefer not to sign. This week our signs are HAPPY and SAD.
